## HCA PROJECTS IN THAILAND

Two of the most recent projects that the HCA has supported are described.

A Congregation of Dominican sisters operate the Our Lady of the Rosary Boarding House for girls in Udon Thani in northern Thailand. This house supports access to educational facilities in the area so that poor families can have their girls receive adequate education. The goal is to allow girls access to realistic life choices that allow them to avoid being absorbed into one of the many child prostitution networks in the country.

In nearby Nong Bua Lamphu, the HCA has supported the Mother of Perpetual Help Aids Centre. Assistance has been given to poor children either infected with AIDS or in families that have been affected. Help has been given in the form of food, milk and educational requirements, in particular school uniforms and stationery requirements.



## Advent 2021

In Advent 2020, Pope Francis wrote:

***“Advent is a continuous call to hope. It reminds us that God is present in history to lead it to its ultimate goal and to its fullness, which is the Lord Jesus Christ. God is present in the history of humanity, He is the ‘God-with-us’, He walks beside us to support us.”***

# YEAR OF ST JOSEPH (2021): PATRON OF CANADA



In the Apostolic Letter "Patris corde" ("With a Father's Heart"), Pope Francis

proclaimed a "Year of Saint Joseph" from 8 December 2020 to 8 December 2021. Saint Joseph is described as "a beloved father, a tender and loving father, an obedient father, an accepting father; a father who is creatively courageous, a working father, a father in the shadows." (Vatican News)



He was chosen as the patron saint of Canada by the first Recollect Franciscan missionaries in 1624. The Jesuit missionaries who followed the Franciscans named several of their missions for St. Joseph. In a letter written in May of 1635, St. Jean de Brebeuf said:

**"We owe much also to our glorious St. Joseph, Spouse of Our Lady and Protector of the Hurons, who has rendered us tangible aid several times."**
